Town of Kendall

At the regular monthly Town Meeting held in said town and county, in the state of Illinois at Kendall Township Hall on Tuesday May 21, 2024. Meeting was called to order at 7:33 PM by Supervisor Steve Gengler. Township officials present were Steve Gengler Supervisor, Doug Westphal Highway Commissioner, Steve Grebner, Township Clerk Cathy Scalise, Kendall Township Assessor and trustees: Carolyn Pottinger, Don Hirsch. Trustees Zach Turnbow and Doug Thanepohn were absent.

No guests were present.

Supervisor Gengler lead the board in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

**Section III: Public Comment and Sheriff Department Update:** Sheriff's Dept Rep was not able to attend, Clerk Grebner provided a MTD status for May of incidents as well as an update of total for April. Evaluated trends and see that 2024 is trending a little higher 2023 as it relates to pure incident count. Clerk Grebner did announce Kendall County has recently received a Mental Health resource shared with other jurisdictions across the county. As part of that discussion Clerk Grebner illustrated the uptick in Crisis interventions month over month in Kendall County. In 80% of the cases, the outcome was hospitalization rather than incarceration. This illustrates the need for more dedicated mental health professionals in the county. In addition, the "take home squad program" for KCSO is nearly complete and this should allow for faster response to calls in the county.

**Section IV: Approve April 2024 Meeting Minutes:** Minutes from Regular April meeting was read. Motion to approve the amended minutes was made by Don Hirsch and seconded by Carolyn Pottinger and motion was approved unanimously. (3 in favor and 2 absent)

**Section V)** Review and discussion of the Temporary 2024 Road Budget occurred. There were no changes since the previous month's meeting. Motion was made by Steve Gengler and seconded by Don Hirsch to approve the Temporary 2024-2025 Road Budget. Roll was called and motion passed unanimously. (3 ayes and 2 absent)

**Section VI: Approve Tentative 2024 -2025 Town Budget (24-03)** Review and discussion of the Temporary 2024-2025 Township Budget. There were some changes in line items. Miscellaneous, Accounting and Legal (for General Assistance) was increased. Building Maintenance was reduced \$25K. Motion was made by Don Hirsch and seconded by Carolyn Pottinger. Motion carried by roll vote "3 Ayes and 2 absent.

### **Section VII: Financial Business:**

A) General Funds and Road District bills were reviewed. Interest earned on CDs continues to be quite good. A motion to approve was made by Don Hirsch and seconded by Steve Gengler. Discussion was called and question was made by Trustee Pottinger as to why the amount of the check was not clearly stated in the Annual Meeting. It was explained that until we researched how many employees qualified due to hour requirement the actual amount would not be known. It was stated however that the estimate was stated. Vote was taken and Motion failed 2 ayes and 1 no. In order to understand the reason for the no vote by Trustee Pottinger more discussion was called for. The minutes of the Annual Meeting were read aloud by Clerk Grebner and in them the electors unanimously approved the payment for this actuarial study. Because of this reading and the unanimous approval of the actuarial study by the voters, it was decided to offer up a revote on the payment of the bills and in this revote there were 3 aye votes and 2 absent. It was stated that the Clerk Grebner would make a notation in the official minutes that this second vote (in favor of the approval of the expenditures) was made with reservation.

B&C) Income report and Settlement sheets were reviewed. Interest being accrued on our CDs continues to do well and very positive for township.

**Reports:**

**Assessor:** Assessor stated Tax Bills have been mailed. In review of the tax bills a discussion was broached about how the various townships do their pensions. In Kendall Township we levy for Social Security. This is really not an accurate representation of our tax bill. We are looking at changing this to be a more accurate representation.

**Highway Commissioner:** Special Bid Letting for East Highpoint for shoulder, paving and striping. Cleaning and cutting out brush along Pavilion Road is being done. Walker road work has been completed. Getting a lot of compliments on the work being done. Provided the Conservation Drive Roadway Agreement that will be signed and filed with the County. (this restricts the weight and access to A/D properties for all trucks) Bonnell is telling us September is still the date for the completion of new truck.

**Clerk's Report:** Shared copy of Sheriff's Dept Activity – (as mentioned above). See attachment "A

**Supervisor:** Supervisor wanted to clarify the extra expense for Mileage and this was for the hauling of the Fireproof container for backups. While Supervisor was able to secure this for free, he used his own pickup truck to deliver it to the township building. He has been working to consolidate the two parcels that make up Pavilion Cemetery into 1 single parcel. Paperwork is with the new lawyer, and it will be Pavilion Cemetery in care of Kendall Township. (question was is it "Kendall Township" or "Township of Kendall") Landscaping around new signage will be bid out as there has been an inquiry by a company. The cemetery CD has been renewed at a 5% rate for 7 months.

**Other Items/Information:** There was no other Items or information discussed

No other items were brought forth and motion to adjourn was made by Don Hirsch and Seconded Carolyn Pottinger at 8:51 PM. Approved unanimously by voice vote. Meeting was adjourned.

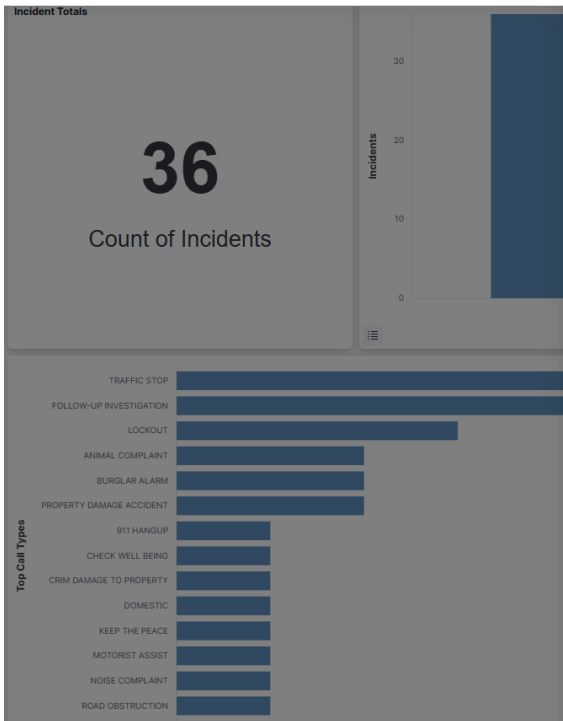

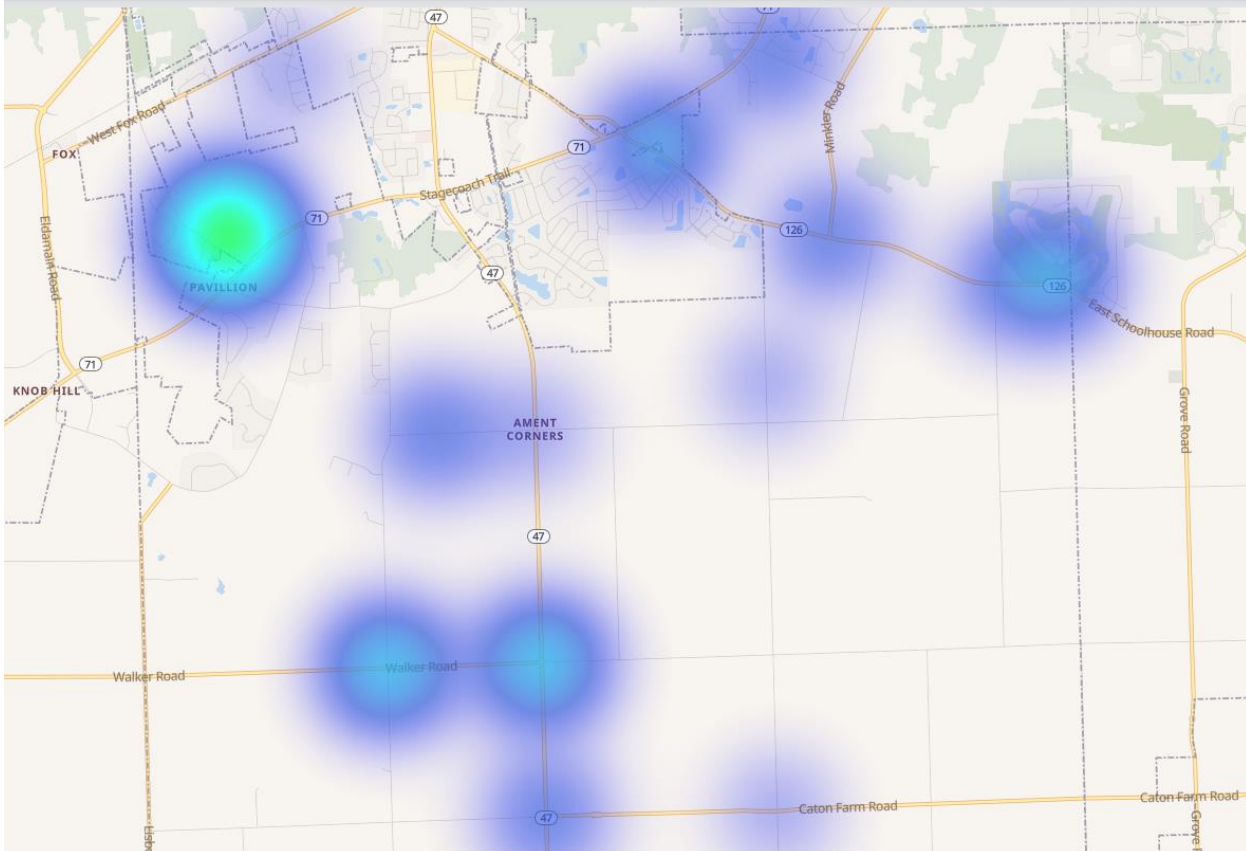

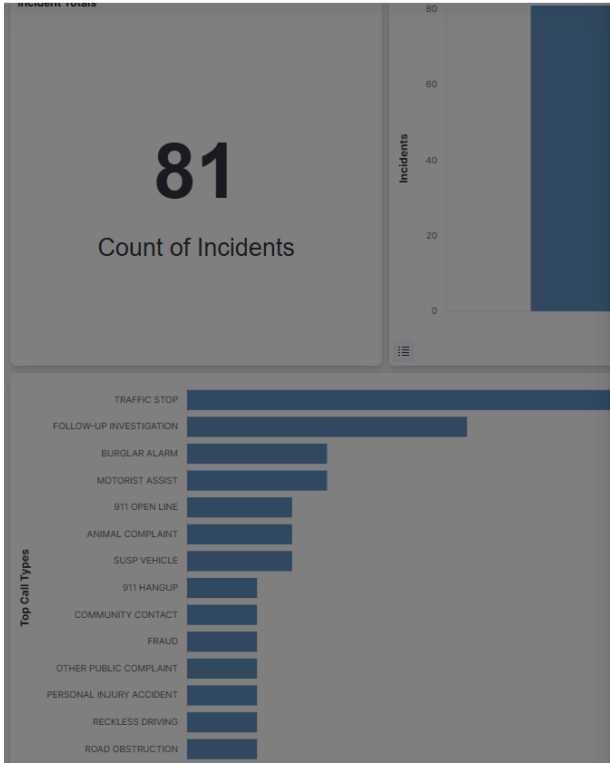
